

There is no difference in the symmetry and ratios for the head of the Dog and Bitch, except for the depth of the stop and general size and mass. In the dog, the stop is more pronounced and the head is more massive in size. 8 A Roman nose occurs when the septum slants downward causing the topline of the muzzle to slant downward at the nostrils. 9. So the reach for the front arm can be at its maximum extension resulting in maximum efficiency during gait 10. Preferred dark. 11. True. 12. P1 lower left and right 13. Mahogany 14. The head. It contains 7 sub categories, 4 serious faults, 6 disqualifications. 15. Neck and Thighs

^{1. 60/40} or 3/2 2. Slightly arched as seen from a profile 3. True 4.False. Dome shaped skulls are faulty and are always associated with too much pronunciation in the stop. Like the head of the Boxer. 5. False. Loose flews are a fault. They are usually accompanied with wet, throaty head types. 6. True. 7. The zygomatic arch. It means that the zygomatic arch is shallow 8. Loose skin at the jaw bone, under the throat and on the topskull. 9 True. The bridge of the muzzle should be straight. The tip if the nose should not have a dip in it.10. Winter nose refers to an anomaly, which causes the color of the nostrils to have a light colored line running up and down the nose. It is only seen during the winter months. 11. True 12. True. The standard states "Ears are to be set well apart, hanging forward with the inner edge lying tightly against the head. 13. The stop is located between the eyes. It should be well pronounced. 14. The channel that is seen running from the stop to the mid topskull. 15. True. 16. True. The end of the muzzle is broad with a well-developed chin.
